Whether it's engaging in dynamic discussions on topics like curriculum development, effective feedback, artificial intelligence, the job market, or CPT coding and billing, or promoting the field of pathology and the CAP community to medical students and pathology applicants in the CAP Meetings, or through webinars, social media, coaching zoom meetings, I've seen firsthand how consistent, small-scale efforts can spark broad improvements. For example, after attending last year's RF Spring Meeting, I helped implement effective feedback initiatives within my own residency program, an experience that reinforced the power of collaboration and idea-sharing among residents. Also at the Fall Meeting I connected with first-time attendees, especially medical students and pathology applicants and have since supported several of them in their career journeys.

As a fourth-year resident, with a master in education and prior experience as an assistant professor of pathology in my home country, I offer the perspective of someone who has lived the full arc of residency training and understands both its strengths and its opportunities for growth. As a senior resident I not only teach students and externs at the hospital but I also teach students at the university campus as well. My current work as a teaching assistant at the University Of lowa Carver College Of Medicine, has prepared me to effectively communicate complex concepts, foster inclusive learning environments, and engage learners at all levels.

Additionally, through my roles as a USCAP Ambassador and Match to Path mentor, I've been able to advocate for pathology trainees, promote national engagement, and support initiatives aimed at enhancing resident professional development and wellness. I look forward to fostering collaboration between trainees, residency program leaders, the RFEC and CAP representatives to help build a solid and well-rounded residency training and shape a more connected and empowered pathology trainee community.
