
IMG's GME Representation






Understanding different pathways




Start Applying Early and Widely

How to reach the employers?

- Who Both academic and private practices
- Highlight your strengths in CV and personal statements based on the practice of choice
- Be up front, mention your visa requirement in your cover letter and your CV
- Networking !!!!!!!!!!!



Networking – Start Early!!

- Attend conferences
- Join committees or being ambassador of various organisations
- Social media : Twitter, LinkedIn, Facebook
- Get involved in State societies

Basically, Be VISIBLE



O1 visa



• The O-1 nonimmigrant visa is for the individual who possesses extraordinary ability in the sciences, arts, education, business, or athletics, or who has a demonstrated record of extraordinary achievement in the motion picture or television industry and has been recognized nationally or internationally for those achievements.

Make your CV strong in case something goes wrong: Research, Committees, Journal Reviewer etc.



Which employer to pick when you have multiple offers?

- Someone with prior experience with visa process
- Preferred Route of J1 process
- Potential for Professional growth and Green Card
- Of course, where you will be most happy and grow!!
