



*Independent Laboratory = Stand alone laboratories, reference laboratories, and specialized laboratories


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FASCINATING FINDING 1: Practice testing volume continues to increase from early COVID-19 levels

CP and AP volume have increased substantially in 2021 compared to 2020



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About 90% of practice leaders expect total 2021 testing volume to exceed 2020 levels

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FASCINATING FINDING 2: Data suggests evidence of practice consolidation


Results suggests a substantial decrease in the share of smaller practice; increase in larger practices

of FTE Pathologists in the Practice at the End of the Prior Year, 2016, 2018, and 2021 Practice Leader Surveys

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19% of practices were involved in some kind of merger or acquisition in the last two years

FASCINATING FINDING 3: Data reveal a mixed message on pathologist ownership of practices

The share of practices owned by pathologists is virtually unchanged from 2018

It looks like there has been little change in practice ownership by pathologists since 2018.

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FASCINATING FINDING 4: Consolidation among hospitals and physician clients is also affecting pathology practices

FASCINATING FINDING 5: The pathologist job market even stronger than in recent years

Job market for pathologists in 2021

- 56% of practice leaders say that they expect to hire at least one pathologist in 2021
- This represents a continuing upward trend from our prior Practice Leader Surveys, which asked about hiring in 2015 and 2017


For most settings, the share of practices hiring pathologists has risen since 2017—often substantially




~ ¼ of practices do not receive Part A payments for laboratory services provided or do not get to negotiate their Part A payments

At least 54% of practices bill for PC of CP for all or some insurers


Does your practice directly bill insurers other than Medicare for the professional component of clinical pathology (PC of CP) services? (n=295)

Approximately what percent of your practice's 2020 total revenues came from payments for the professional component of clinical pathology services? (n=194)




