- Embracing, incorporating and maximizing the use of Al and new technologies: Pathologists need to "own" future testing, adoption and validation; support efforts through PT and LAP; target communication to medical communities and public;
- Building stakeholder recognition of the pathologist physician and our value on the medical care team, community health and medical advancement: Leverage and raise our profile by engaging diverse stakeholders to strengthen our specialty and leadership in healthcare delivery and initiatives;
- Strategic alignment with a growth mindset: As a revenue generating organization with incredible programs and human capital, continued strategic alignment of programs and resources through communication and collaboration is critical to strengthen the organization in the changing healthcare environment.



# IF ELECTED, WHAT DO YOU HOPE TO ACCOMPLISH?

As a member of the Board of Governors, I will create and promote a clear vision of the future by capitalizing on lessons learned from past and present initiatives.

Our story has a past, present and future.
