



Quality Payment Program rules have changed for 2022 and performance thresholds are higher.

Large practices (16+ clinicians) cannot score high enough to avoid a MIPS penalty **when only reporting QPP measures**.

Maximum total points that can be earned for Quality Score using QPP/CQM measures	42
Weighted Quality Score Contribution to MIPS Final Score (85%)	59.5 points
Maximum Number of points earned with Improvement Activities	40
Weighted IA Score Contribution to MIPS Final Score (15%)	15 points
Estimated Final MIPS Score solely using QPP measures	74.5 points
Does the MIPS Final Score meet the performance threshold to avoid penalties?	No

Disclaimer:

Points calculations are based on weighting applied to pathology practices with 16 or more pathologists on staff, who do not qualify as a small practice in MIPS, and assume maximum point earning potential.

Maximum points value is 7 points per QPP/CQM measure assuming data completeness and maximum performance is achieved by a practice.

Actual points earned will vary by performance of the practice.
